INSTRUCTIONS FOR USE





Wash first your hands carefully, with water and soap :

Follow these five steps every time.

- a. Wet your hands with clean, running water (warm or cold), turn off the tap, and apply soap.
- b. **Lather** your hands by rubbing them together with the soap. Lather the backs of your hands, between your fingers, and under your nails.
- c. **Scrub** your hands for at least 20 seconds. Need a timer? Hum the "Happy Birthday" song from beginning to end twice.
- d. **Rinse** your hands well under clean, running water.
- e. **Dry** your hands using a clean towel or air dry them.

Disinfecting hands is an option, if hands are not specifically dirty (hydroalcoholic lotion or equivalent).



Open the box, remove a single mask from the packaging by **holding the side** of the mask.

Close the box for hygienic storage.



Hold the mask flat in front of you.

This way you can easily **pull the lower elastic** and hold the mask to the chin whilst
bringing the 1st headband over your head.

The nose bar should be on top.



Bring the **lower elastic** over the head and position it at the **back of the neck** in line with the chin. That way the mask is already quite well positioned in front of the face.



First **open the folds** of the mask and hold it under your chin to keep the protective part in place in front of your mouth.



Then bring the **2nd elastic over the head**, in maintaining the protective surface in your mouth, and position it towards the crown of the head.



Adjust again first elastic in the neck (if needed).



Adjust the nose-wire to squeeze the mask around the nose and to fully close the top part.



The mask should be disposed any time you remove it, if it gets dirty and certainly after 4 hours of continuous use.



Remove the mask by using both thumbs, starting with the lower elastic in the neck. At ear level, the upper elastic will automatically come together and both will be removed at the same time. During that time, the protective part of the mask remains positioned on your mouth.



Try not to hold/touch the outer layer of the mask as this could be contaminated and your hand may come in to contact with your face.



Do not remove the mask by pulling the protective surface to the top of your head (to avoid any face / eyes contamination)



Once removed, dispose of the mask **in a** waste bag and a bin, then wash again your hands as explained in step 1.
